BACKGROUND


- COVID-19 affected millions

METHODS

In-depth semi-structured interviews

- Interview guide developed
- Recruitment of executive nursing representatives
- Recorded, transcribed, (translated), coded, thematically analyzed



LACK OF A VOICE, RECOGNITION, AND APPRECIATION

"There is a general recognition, recognized by the [healthcare] leaders, by society, by all, but [anything] concrete at the policy level, nothing really happens. And that frustrates nurses"

(POR-1)

"Federal government [provided] guidance... and then provinces and territories [created] their own, making their own decisions based off of that guidance, and then each public health unit [created] their own rollout for the implementation of the actual vaccine" (CAN-2)






